BENEFITS

- Helps alleviate the critical nursing shortage by adding trained family members to perform tasks delegated to them by nurses and overseen by physicians
- Ensures continuity of care and consistency, reducing negative events and lowering hospital admission rates (other states seeing >90% reduction)
- Increases stability for the medically fragile child; their care plan is executed every single day
- Supports families - Trained family caregivers have a job; they are employed by the Home Health Agency, they are skilled professionals caring for their child, and are less reliant on public assistance
- Reduces administrative burden for providers; scheduling and conflict burdens reduced
- States that adopt the Home Health Aide for Medically Fragile Children Program see savings of 30-50% on every hour of PDN billed
